Re: Oral History Proposal

Dear Elizabeth:

Following up on my meeting with the Bar Commission in August (after my return from extensive travel and dealing with several client emergencies) please consider this letter to be a proposal as the Commission requested for my suggested series of living histories of some of our great lawyers. As I stated, we have lost too many great lawyers in the recent past whose lives, war stories and wisdom should have been preserved for the ages. As I did on my own dime for my friend Larry Weiss. If the benefit of doing so is not self-evident to everyone I will not waste my time trying to explain it. I try not to waste time restating what should be obvious.

First, I propose that a small working group be formed to select the lawyers whose life stories should be saved. I have a list that I have previously provided as does Alan Sullivan. I am sure that there are many others. As I stated to the Commission, I hate bureaucracy but I am sure that a few of us, over a few bottles of fine wine that I would be happy to provide, can come up with a pretty good list pretty quickly. I propose that we try to do between 3 and 4 videos per year.

The format would be pretty simple. Someone is chosen to do the interviews; either a friend of the subject or someone with experience in doing this type of interview. I would be happy to assist. The subject and interviewer would meet and layout the subjects and stories to be covered. The interview would be conducted in a convivial location such as the person's home. An informal location unless the subject feels more comfortable in a more formal location. Probably 3 cameras (they can be remotely controlled so you just need one shooter). For an interview of approximately 1 hour of final material I believe that it will likely take 3 - 4 hours of raw video. After the video is shot it will be edited to take out the dead air, repetitions, etc. and to get the run time to about an hour.

Based on my prior experience and, also, checking around with other video production companies, I believe that the total cost for production, including editing, should be less than \$5,000 per video. (I do not believe that perfection is required; this is life, not a Ken Burns production.) Thus, the maximum total cost per year would be either \$15,000 or \$20,000 per year depending on whether there were 3 or 4 shootings in any one year. I believe that some of this cost could be offset by using the videos for CLE and charging a small amount. I know that at least 220 people watched the Larry Weiss video at the Annual Meeting a few years ago to very positive reviews. Since I am not a CLE provider I really cannot hazard a guess about how much of the production costs could be recouped from that income stream. I also do not know if any of the production costs could be raised by contributions from any of the sections. (And I don't want to waste time getting started to find out.)

But I do know that what I am proposing is a mere pittance in a total annual budget of about \$8,000,000. And I do know that we should all feel very badly if any more great lawyers like Gordon Roberts die without having their lives and wisdom preserved for the benefit of our profession. The celebration of Gordie's life at the Country Club was nice and we all shared stories about him but the attendance was, by definition, limited and the experience evanescent.

I stand ready, willing and (fortunately) able to assist. I also look forward to any input from Alan.

I would simply ask that this proposal be considered with something greater than "all deliberate speed". Time and the grim reaper wait for no man or woman. I look forward to hearing from you.

1. President's Welcome and Reports

1.1 Introduction of New Bar Staff

Elizabeth Wright introduced the new bar staff to the commissions: Nathan Severin, director of finance, Andrea Donahue, director of the Office of Legal Services Innovation, Maribeth LeHoux, general counsel, and Brooke Muir, assistant executive director.

Ms. Wright acknowledged Jeannine Timothy for her 26 years of service to the Consumer Assistance Program.

Mr. Christiansen reported from the NCBP and the trends discussed at the conference, particularly for younger lawyers, the role of AI in the profession, and mentorship within the bar. From the ABA meeting, Mr. Christiansen discussed the goals and focus of the new ABA president, as well as the growth of affinity bars. Ms. Wright discussed topics from the National Bar Executives meetings.

1.5 ABA House of Delegates' Meeting

This agenda item was skipped.

2. Information Items

2.1 Bar Building Improvement Updates

Ms. Wright provided an update on the improvements at the Utah Law & Justice Center, including updates to the bathrooms and replacing the skylight.

2.2 Admissions Updates: Emily Lee

Ms. Lee provided an update on the July bar exam, including test accommodations. She discussed the process of grading and put out a call for graders. The admissions ceremony in October will be at the Salt Palace at noon on October 27, 2023. Year-to-Date (YTD) Net Profit – Accrual Basis:

YTD net profit is \$3,351,214 and is \$262,359 less than budgeted. To follow July's results, it must be noted that August also maintained unfavorable results between both revenues and expenses. YTD Section Event losses will not start allocating to their respective sections until October, which accounts for some of the unfavorable variance among expenses.

YTD Net Profit –Cash Basis: Adding back year-to-date depreciation expense of \$23,476 and deducting capital expenditures of \$66,766, the cash basis year-to-date net profit is approximately \$(43,290) lower.

Explanations for Departments with Net Profit Variances more than \$10k and 5% Over/Under Budget:

<u>Admissions</u>: Admissions is currently reporting a \$49,934 favorable variance compared to the budget. Budgeted revenues are favorable \$12,183 across all revenue streams, expenses are favorable by \$28,337.

<u>NLTP</u>: NLTP revenues are at 135% of the budgeted figures, and expenses are favorable at 70% of budget among all three functional expenses categories.

OPC: Expenses allocated to OPC are \$10,093 more than budgeted YTD, 108% of total. Travel expenses related to conferences and higher General & Administrative costs contributed to this overage.

<u>CLE</u>: CLE is reporting a \$(3,537) net loss compared to the budgeted net profit of \$17,604 which is a \$(21,141) unfavorable variance. Revenues have caught up from July, turning positive, but all expenses come in at \$149% of budget, related mostly to Program Services. These expenses will be offset as profits/losses are allocated as Section Events start closing over the next few months.

Summer Convention: The Summer Convention shows a net profit of \$28,938 YTD. However, there is a \$29,000 shortfall of sponsor revenue compared to budget, a likely result of the online series. Total expenses are right on target.

Member Services: YTD Revenue is \$(33,948), or 60%, less than budgeted. All expenses remain at just 59% less than budgeted, though. The net of this results in a \$(18,223) unfavorable variance YTD.

Public Services: Fiscal year 2024 budgeted grant revenue of \$109,539, which required recognition in fiscal year 2023. This was recognized as required, and thus understates revenues at only 18% of budget YTD. Total expenses are over budget by \$13,757, or 8%.

UTAH STATE BAR Budget and Finance Committee Financial Results as of August 31, 2023 and for the two months then ended

Bar Operations: Bar Operations has seen an 11% overspend among budgeted expenses. Netted against a favorable investment income, the net loss of \$(17,032) is 5% over budget YTD.

Facilities: A combination of rental revenues being at 77% YTD, or \$(4,957) less than budgeted, and overspend for Program Services, a net loss of \$(19,418) is being recognized YTD.

LSI: Grant Income shall be retroactively recognized after payment is received for partial funding of this new department. This budget is in line otherwise.

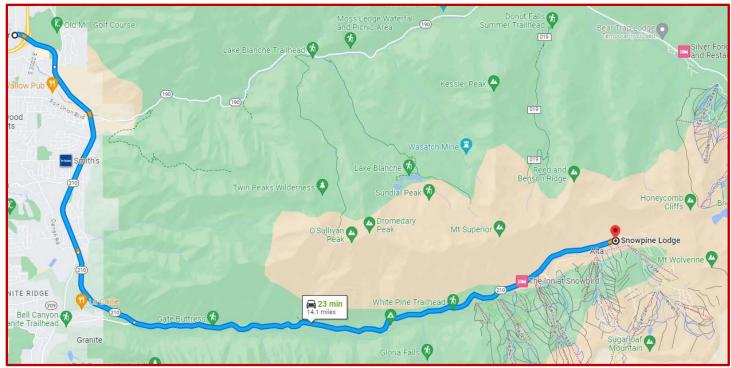
